	Our Met Service does collect climate data. Other information however is not collected regularly and sometimes is not analyzed further. Current indicators are not fully relevant to the Cook Islands or some component needed to complete analysis of the indicator may not be collected. Data collection programmes are not high on the national priority list for funding despite the need for evidence informed decision making. Further support is needed in this area and national activities are underway to improve statistics and indicators collected in order to integrate national data demands with relevant international reporting requirements, and strengthen available data for decision making and reporting. Long term support for environment monitoring systems is needed to ensure regular, quality data on DLDD.

Support is needed for the Pacific subregion for NAP alignment. While a number of Pacific islands have accessed funding under GEF for NAP alignment, we are still waiting for the training workshop on NAP alignment that has been promised since 2012 but has not eventuated. Given the target of 80% of NAPs aligned by Dec 2014 and our issues of limited capacity and resources, it is obvious that the Pacific subregion as a whole will be unable to meet this target, which reflects poorly on our region while potentially hindering our ability to mobilize further resources for UNCCD/DLDD/SLM activities.
