(1) Eritrea lies on the Sudano-Sahelian zone and is aware of the fact that the Sahara Desert is encroaching slowly. It supports the objectives of the Great Green Wall Initiative and is working tirelessly on the implementation of this Initiative. The MoA is advocating and lobbying the importance of this Initiative through TV and radio programmes and daily newspapers to communities on the importance of this Initiative.

(2). The MoA, the focal ministry for UNCCD, prepares IEC materials & distributes them to extension agents & farming communities. These materials help them to upgrade their knowledge, skill, know-how and experience in managing their resources in a sustainable way.

(3). The MoA and the MoLW&E in collaboration with the Ministry of Information prints IEC materials in local newspapers on issues related to DLDD, biodiversity and climate change. These materials are used to raise the awareness of the farming communities on the need for and the importance of sustainable use of natural resources.

(4). Ministries of Agriculture, Health, Land, Water & Environment & Postal Authority each include DLDD, CBD and UNFCCC awareness raising slogans on their annual posters and calendars.

(5). June 17, 2013 was celebrated in Eritrea as the World Day to Combat Desertification during which the message of the then UNCCD Executive Secretary Dr Luc Gnacadja was read. Message of the MoA in connection with the event was also published in the local newspapers. In this day the UNCCD Focal Team members gave an exclusive interview with the radio programme in which it explained the main objectives of the WDCD which shows the dedication and political will of Eritrea towards combating desertification and fighting hunger.

(6) The Forestry and Wildlife Proclamation 155/2006. The Proclamation allows communities and individual farmers to have woodlots. Community owned are managed by communities and when trees mature they are harvested and sold at market price. The sale of these products is used for communal purposes; while in the case of individually owned woodlots the cash obtained from the sale of these products is used for the individual's own use. In this intervention communities as well as individual farmers are obliged to construct physical soil and water conservation structures and plant trees. The Proclamation encourages CSOs/CBOs to protect and rehabilitate marginal lands.

(7) Provision of financial and material support: The State of Eritrea through its line ministries provides CSOs and STIs with financial & material support such as improved agricultural inputs which assist the recipients to implement DLDD related activities, climate smart agriculture, to construct physical soil and water conservation structures. These inputs help them to plant trees and thus increase biodiversity and agric-yield per unit area thus improving their livelihoods. Such government interventions help in increasing the number of CSOs and STIs.

(8) Establishment of Green Clubs: Green Clubs are established in schools where students plant multipurpose tree species on their school compounds and in their homesteads. Each student plants a tree and is responsible to manage it properly. When mature these trees provide shade for students. As of today there are 106 School Green Clubs and it is planned that within the coming one or two years all schools will have established Green Clubs.

(9) Students' Summer Campaign: in Eritrea schools are closed from July to mid September which is the main rainy season. The MoE mobilizes students, teachers and school directors to go to villages and semi-urban areas to construct/maintain SWC structures coupled with tree planting. The MoA provides technical support, farm tools & tree seedlings, In addition to these the students play a major role in raising the awareness of farmers the importance of sustainable resources management. These activities have been carried out voluntarily since 1994.

(10) Provision of improved indigenous biomass saving stoves: Rural households prepare meals using traditional stoves which consume a lot of firewood and are energy inefficient. Currently rural households are being provided with energy efficient stoves which consume less wood hence decreasing in deforestation.

As seen in the above lines the number of CSOs has increased from 7 in 2012 to 13. The percentage increase is $(6/7 * 100) = 85\%$
The number of STIs has increased from 10 in 2012 to 16 in 2013. The percentage increase is $(6/11 * 100) = 55\%$.

Provide a short description of actions taken at the national level to promote participation by CSOs and STIs in the Convention processes.

(1) In Eritrea two to three villages cluster together and form an administrative unit. Among other things, this unit has a well established organization called Village Development Committee (VDC) whose members are democratically elected from within the villagers. The VDC has sub committees among which NRM is one of these. The main functions of this subcommittee is to mobilise villagers to carry out physical soil and water conservation structures, tree planting, to train male and female farmers on issues related to NRM, SLM and conservations agriculture. The MoA assigns extension agents to assist this sub-committee. This structural arrangement encourages communities to participate in DLDD related activities.

(2) Development of project proposals: Experts of the MoA, MoLW&E, MoMR, MoH, etc assist CSOs in preparing DLDD, climate change and biodiversity related project proposals and in finding potential funding agencies and submitting these projects to these agencies,

(2) Provision of technical advice: Experts of the MoA, MoLW&E, MoMR, MoH give technical advice to CSOs and STIs on fields related to DLDD, biodiversity and climate change so that they could practice climate smart agriculture, conservation agriculture, etc.

(3) Participation in workshops/seminars and study tours: The MoA, MoLW&E, MoMR and other line ministries dealing with DLDD, climate changes and biodiversity occasionally arrange workshops/seminars and study tours on DLDD, climate changes and biodiversity. These line ministries invite members of CSOs and STIs to participate in these workshops/seminars and study tours. These enable the participants to exchange experiences, views and gain new technologies. They also improve their skills and know-how ultimately leading to improving their livelihoods. Such practices play a positive role in attaining food and nutrition security, and poverty alleviation

(4) Provision of incentives: The MoA gives awards to communities (CBOs/CSOs) in the form of financial and material support such as the provision of modern and improved agricultural inputs for example, farm implements (water pumps, pick axe, spades, wheel barrows, hoes), improved vegetable seeds and fruit seedlings, modern beehives and accessories, etc to farming communities that showed good performances in afforestation/reforestation, establishment and management of enclosures, construction and installation of improved biomass saving stoves, establishment of School Green Clubs, in carrying out climate smart agriculture and conservation agriculture, etc. These incentives/reward encourage CBOs/CSOs and STIs increase in number and to work hard on environmental rehabilitation activities.

(5) Micro-Credit and Savings Enterprise: this enterprise lends cash money at a very minimum rate to CSOs/CBOs and STIs so that they can purchase modern agricultural inputs such as farm tools to be used in the construction of physical soil and water conservation structures in denuded hills, soil and stone buds along farms and for planting tree seedlings. This intervention protects the environment in general and soils from erosion and increases soil fertility leading to the increase of biodiversity an agric- yield whose ultimate aim is to improve living standards of the general public.

6) Cooperatives: farming communities with the support from the government establish cooperatives which are run by farmers. These cooperatives sell agricultural inputs (farm tools, inorganic fertilizers, seeds, etc) to farmers at a much reduced price. The farm tools are used to carry out physical soil and water conservation structures and to plant tree seedlings. The improved seeds and fertilizers are used to boost agric-production. This arrangement increases CSOs/CBOs and STIs to work on land and water effectively and in a sustainable ways. It also increases the number of CSOs/CBO on SLM activities tremendously.

(7). Commercial Banks of Eritrea and Eritrean Development & Investment Banks: These banks lend cash money to CSOs/CBOs and STIs to make invest on land such as in beef cattle fattening, poultry, dairy, sheep fattening, beekeeping, small scale irrigation such as horticulture. The cash borrowed could also be used for the purchase of improved vegetable and crop seeds and fruit seedlings and tractors.

The percentage increase of CSOs initiatives is about 50% i.e. the increase is from 10 to 15. These initiative include training and hands-on practices in family farming, drip irrigation skills, spate irrigation, various aspects of conservation agriculture, home gardening, many aspects of construction of physical soil and water conservation structures, developing and strengthening many aspects of integrated pest management practices, indigenous knowledge-cum-modern aspects of apiary including queen bee rearing, among others

As to the initiatives undertaken by STIs the increase is 40% i.e. from 8 to 10.

Operational objective 1: Advocacy, awareness raising and education

Provide a short description of actions taken at the national level to increase the number of DLDD-related initiatives of CSOs and STIs in the field of education.

1. Human resources development: Members of CSOs and STIs are invited to attend workshops/seminars/training sessions on DLDD, biodiversity and climate change. These sessions increase the number of DLDD related initiatives of CSOs and STIs in the field of education through improving to improve their knowledge, skill and know how.
 2. Establishment of Demonstration plots: The Government through the Ministry of Agriculture establishes plots on farmers' land to demonstrate to farmers (communal or individuals) techniques on sustainable land management techniques; encourage farming communities to own and run tree nurseries so that they could plant tree seedlings in their own land and when mature the farmers sell the product for their own use. The farmers get cash income from the sale of multipurpose tree and/or fruit seedlings.
 3. Establishment of woodlots: The Government has issued Proclamation on Forests and Wildlife. According to this Proclamation farmers are allowed to establish community and individually owned woodlots. The products obtained from the former are used for communal purposes such as construction/maintenance of schools, roads, health centres, clinics, etc while products obtained from the latter are used for individual uses. These interventions play a vital role in improving the environment reducing soil and water erosion and increase in biodiversity.
 4. Provision of financial and material support: The Government of the State of Eritrea allocates budget annually to CSOs/CBOs and STIs to carry out activities related to DLDD, climate smart agriculture, conservation agriculture, management of biodiversity, etc . The government through its line ministries provide CSOs/CBOs and CSTIs with agricultural inputs such as water pumps, shovels, pick axes/mattocks, wheelbarrows, plastic hoses, watering cans, hammer, improved cereal and vegetable seeds, fruit seedlings. organic fertilizers, etc to support them in the implementation of the above mentioned activities. The support given by the State encourages the recipient CSOs and STIs to increase in number and be profitable.
 5. Saving and Credit organization: This is a financial institution which lends money at a very low rate to CBOs/CSOs and STIs to start up any type of investment on the land. CBOs/CSOs and STIs borrow cash money and carry out investment on their piece of land with the cash money they borrowed. The recipients can purchase bees and get organic honey and honey by-products, they can buy small farm machineries and inorganic fertiliser or improved cereal and vegetable seeds as well as fruit seedlings and improve crop diversification and agricultural yield per unit area. They can also purchase farm tools to be used for the construction of physical soil and water conservation structures along denuded hills and construct soil and stone bunds along their farm lands to protect their lands from soil and water erosion This arrangement improves the living conditions of the recipient CBOs/CSOs.
 6. Establishment of Green Clubs: Green Clubs are established in each school where students plant multipurpose tree species on their school compounds and in their homesteads. Each student plant a tree and is responsible to manage it i.e. water, weed. protect from being eaten up by grazing animals. When mature these trees are used as shade trees for students.
 7. Students' Summer Campaign: in Eritrea schools are closed from July to mid of September during which the main rains fall. The Ministry of Education mobilizes students, teachers and school directors to go to villages and semi-urban areas to construct/maintain physical soil and water conservation structures such as terraces and check dams along denuded hills which are coupled with multipurpose tree planting, mulching and weeding and other cultural practices. In addition to these the students assist farmers to construct/maintain soil and stone bunds on farm lands. These activities environment and play a positive role in improving the environment and in attaining food and nutrition security and in alleviating poverty. These activities are carry out for one month and is voluntary. The MoA provides technical support and tree seedlings, the Ministry of Communication provides transportation and the Ministry of Health assigns medical personnel.
- These activities have been going on since 1994. From the period 1994 to 2012 about 21 million multipurpose tree seedlings have been planted in an area of about 10,500 hectares of land; about 3.0 million hectares have been rehabilitated against different types of erosion. These interventions includes both newly constructed physical soils and water conservation structures and those repaired; 683, 131 m³ of check dams constructed and of repaired and 714,000 km and 90,785 km of soil/stone bunds constructed and repaired on farm lands, respectively. In addition to hands-on training the students also gain knowledge on rural life.

The Government has also opened up new schools, colleges and higher training institutes that produce trained manpower in the field of natural resources management. These training institutes cater the needs of the farming communities as they train male and female farmers. All these interventions are signs of political will and dedication of the government aiming at implementing the NAP.

The Government of the State of Eritrea (GoSE) and its people give top priority to conserving, developing and utilizing its natural resources in a sustainable way. Attaining food and nutrition security and food sovereignty, poverty alleviation and increasing employment opportunities are some of the pivotal measures undertaking in Eritrea. However, the Government and its people recognise that in order these to happen the environment should be rehabilitated through different means such as the construction of physical soil and water conservation structures coupled with multipurpose tree planting, construction of different types of water points, provision of biomass saving alternative energy sources, developing human and institutional capacity, among others.

Some of the strategies to apply the above mentioned activities are as follows:

1. Establishment of SLM platform: SLM Platform is established at headquarters, zoba and sub zoba levels throughout the country. The main objectives of the Platform are to raise the awareness of the public in general and the farming communities in particular on the need for and importance of sustainable land management and to oversee, supervise and monitor the above mentioned activities.

Each SLM Platform be it at the national or zoba or at the sub zoba stage has three levels of operation. At the national level the 1st level of operation is composed of Ministers of line ministries working in the field of DLDD-related, biodiversity conservation and development and climate change viz. the three Rio Conventions (UNCCD, CBD and UNFCCC) These Ministries include Ministry of Agriculture, Ministry of Land, Water and Environment, Ministry of Information, Ministry of Health, Ministry of National Development, Ministry of Tourism, Ministry of Mines and Energy, Ministry of Trade and Industry, Ministry of Finance, Ministry of Marine Resources, Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Ministry of Defence. The 2nd level is made up of Director Generals of these line ministries while the 3rd level is composed of senior experts in the discipline of soil and water conservation, forestry, wildlife, environmental sciences, natural sciences, climatology, among others.

This structural arrangement is replicated at the zoba (regional) and sub zoba levels. At the zoba level the first level is composed of Zoba Administrator, Director Generals of Social Affairs and Economic development and Infrastructure while at the 2nd level it is made up of Heads of branch offices of the above mentioned line ministries and the level is composed of senior experts at the zoba level. This structural arrangement is replicated at the sub zoba level

The team of experts at the national level meet every month, The team of experts at national, zoba and sub zoba levels jointly visit project sites where DLDD-related activities are being carried out. These experts supervise and monitor project activities and give technical advice on site. The team of experts submits its reports to the 2nd level of the Platform. The 2nd level visits project site, whenever it is deemed necessary and submits its reports to the highest level of the Platform for higher decisions.

2. Focal Point team meeting: every month there is a regular meeting of the three Rio Conventions' focal point teams. In this meeting the focal point of each Convention gives a brief account of any development made either from the Conventions' web site, magazine, newspaper or from any other sources. This practice enables to exchange ideas and views and suggestions as to the way forward are made.

3. Workshop/seminar: When either of the focal point ministries arrange workshops/seminars on their respective fields of intervention i.e. the MoA in the area of UNCCD and the MoLW&E in the area of CBD and UNFCCC all three focal team members participate in the workshop/seminar and share views and ideas.

4. Exchange of reading materials: Print outs from web sites of each of the Conventions are circulated to each of the three focal point teams. This enables each of the focal team to share experience and to be aware of what is new in the Conventions processes.

5. The Ministries of Agriculture, Health, Land, Water and Environment and Postal Authority annually prepare posters, brochures, calendars, note books and agendas that assist them to advertise their institutions. in these advertisements are includes slogans on the need for UNCCD, CBD and UNFCCC. These slogans, short sentences and phrases and wise words that could raise the awareness of the general public. These posters, brochures, note books are distributed to the general public and to institutions free of charge or very minimum cost in order to feel ownership and responsibilities..

1. Establishment of Human Resources Development (HRD) Unit: The focal point ministry has established a responsible unit to develop its human resources through different means) i.e. workshops/seminars/study tours. adequate budget is allocated to run these activities. The Unit assess every year the capacity needs of the ministry. In collaboration with the Ministry of Education and the Institute of Higher Education it facilitates distant education, scholarships and fellowship.

2. Opening up of higher institutes: The Government has opened up higher institutes in which courses on natural resources management and environmental sciences such as soils, water, forestry, wildlife, marine sciences, natural sciences, geography, entomology, soil sciences, soil and water conservation, marine sciences, etc are offered. From these higher institutes every year about 2,500 students graduate in certificate, diploma, 1st and 2nd degrees.

3. Farmers' Training Institute: The MoA has opened up an institute where CBOs/CSOs are trained in natural resources management courses including forestry, soil and water conservation, apiary, etc. Every year about 500 male and female farmers are trained in different agricultural fields such as soil and water conservation, forestry, wildlife, apiculture, plant protection, water management, small scale irrigation, animal husbandry, horticulture, etc

4. Partnerships: one of the main development objectives of Eritrea is partnership development. Eritrea has developed partnerships with many bilateral and multilateral organizations/agencies which provide technical and/or financial support to implement DLDD, climate change and biodiversity related activities.

In addition to the provision of funds and technical support Eritrean experts on DLDD, climate change and biodiversity participate in workshops/seminars, short training courses arranged by these organizations which has a positive role in exposures, experiences and developing and upgrading skills and know-how.

<p>The Government of Eritrea accords NRM a prominent place in its priorities and it is committed to the attainment of its NRM goals. In particular, the Government fully appreciates and continuously emphasizes the decisive role of the people in development & self-reliance. The Government is therefore to create the requisite social and political conditions conducive to their realizations. The Government is aware of the fact that unless and until the environment is managed properly national goals of attaining food & nutrition security, poverty alleviation and reducing unemployment and global goals such as the MDGs especially Goals No1 and 7. To implement the various DLDD-related activities & the Ministry of Agriculture has developed a Five-Year (2014-2018) Development and Strategic Plan . The Government of Eritrea allocates adequate budget to manage its natural resources in a sustainable way. It has also earmarked enough budget for the implementation of the above mentioned Plan. In addition to MoA many ministries, civil society organizations and the army carry out DLDD related activities. The budget allocated for the ministries is easily obtained from the Ministry of Finance. However, the expenditure incurred by other civil societies, the army and the farming communities cannot be easily calculated unless one makes an approximation. They carry out DLDD related activities freely. Such interventions develop and strengthen ownership, participation and involvement of the various stakeholders and sustainability and replicability of the various interventions.</p> <p>We would like to bring to the attention of the reader that a bulk of the activities related to physical construction of soil & water conservations structures coupled planting of multipurpose tree seedlings, construction of water points, etc are carried out by mobilizing communities, the army, members of CSOs whose contribution is difficult to monetize expense incurred in the above mentioned activities. However, efforts have been made to calculate expenditure by taking a bare minimum payment.</p> <p>The Government raises the awareness of its people the need for SLM through its various channels of mass media. Such interventions develop & strengthens participation & resources ownership. Government allocates the above mentioned amount & the budget source is the Ministry of Finance.</p>

- (1). Construction and installation of biomass saving alternative household energy sources: These are
- (a) improved indigenous biomass saving stoves: In rural Eritrea the main source of household energy is firewood. These rural households use indigenous stoves which consume a lot of firewood and are energy inefficient. The MoA in collaboration with the Ministry of Mines and Energy modified the indigenous stoves in such a way that they are more efficient with less burning materials. A compared to the indigenous stoves the improved stoves are more environmentally friendly and are healthier because they emit less smoke as compared to the indigenous stoves. As of to day about 130,000 of such stoves have been constructed and installed in the same number of households. The stoves are easily constructed and installed. Almost all the raw materials needed for the construction of such stoves are easily available locally while some may be procured from the market at very cheap prices. Extension staff of the MoA give training of trainers to women farmers where the trained women in turn train others.
- (b) Bio-gas: As mentioned above fuelwood is the main source of household energy in rural Eritrea and because of this deforestation hence land degradation is high. Currently some rural communities are constructing structures that enable them to produce bio-gas. Though this is at its initial stages it needs back up both financially and technically and the technology of constructing and maintaining the infrastructure has to develop and spread all over the rural as well as in semi-urban communities. Raw materials for the construction of bio-gas and cow manure are available in the rural communities.
- (c) Briquette making: Fuelwood is the main source of household energy in rural Eritrea the source of which is dwindling rapidly hence investors are making briquettes in rural areas and are selling these to rural people at an affordable cost with modest profit.
- (2) Compost preparation: In most rural areas cow dung is used as a source of household energy instead of organic manure as a result of which agric-yield is poor per unit area. Currently farmers have been trained to prepare compost and are using this as organic manure and farmers are now using cow dung as organic manure instead of firewood as a result of which agric-yield per unit area is ascending steadily
- (3) Developing and adopting different irrigation systems
- (a) Irrigation from wells: in relatively dry areas small scale irrigation especially for horticulture and for some cereal crops small-scale irrigation using water from wells is common in rural areas. As time passes by the water level gets lower in which case water shortages do occur. In nowadays farmers are using solar systems to pump water from deep wells instead of water pumps which is economically viable and environmentally friendly. The production is also high in this case. Communities practising this system of irrigation need financial and technical support.
- (b) Drip and sprinkler irrigation: This system of irrigation is economical in that it saves irrigation water and is efficient and some horticulture producing farmers are practising it. The Government of the State of Eritrea has established a factory that produces different types of pipes and accessories that are

suitable for drip irrigation systems. The MoA is advocating for its use and the extension agents of the MoA are teaching the farming communities on the use and importance of this system. Many farmers are adopting this system.

(c) Spate irrigation and water management under drought and water scarcity: This system of irrigation is an ancient form of water harvesting and managing unpredictable and some times destructive flash floods for crop and livestock production. The system is unique for semi-arid and arid areas where it has existed for centuries. Spate irrigation has a long history in Eritrea where it is mostly practised in the lowlands. The area under spate irrigation is on the increase however despite it is the oldest type of irrigation it is still the least studied, understood and documented. There have been some efforts to improve the productivity of spate irrigation with better outcomes. For a long time the main approach was the modernisation of traditional earthen structures with concrete headwork. Experience with this approach has not always been positive and typical issues are the inability to effectively manage sedimentation, the disturbance and imbalances in water distribution and the difficulties of maintenance. Other initiatives have had a less ambitious outlook and have worked with improved traditional flood guiding structures retaining the original distribution of water over a series of intakes of improving the manageability of water within the command area and emphasizing breakthrough in soil moisture conservation and crop agronomy. Though one cannot generalize, such approaches have had more encouraging results that highlighted the considerable scope to reach high productivity in spate irrigation and thus make significant improvements in poverty alleviation and local food & income security.

When rain falls in the highlands of Eritrea river floods flow to the lowlands and specially designed structures using oxen drawn scoops are constructed to hold the water of the rivers. When the water settles on these troughs cereal seeds such as sorghum are sown and when mature they are harvested and the fields are planted with water melons and other horticulture crops which need a little moisture. Communities are taking Initiatives to adopt this system of irrigation. Efforts are being to transfer this system to other regions of the country in which financial and technical support are needed.

1. Funding for:
 (a) Data collection, analysis and report writing: As mentioned above a team of experts were selected from relevant line ministries to collect and to analyze the collected data and write up this report which needs some budget at least to cover some miscellaneous daily expenses such as transportation. The team may be asked to work overtime, or to go to the field and collect some data. We, therefore, request the UNCCD Secretariat to set aside budget for report writing in future.
 (b) As cited above different experts with varied knowledge and experiences on DLDD, climate change and biodiversity were involved in the preparation and writing up of this report. It is mandatory to have this Report validated. Though budget was not allocated from UNCCD Secretariat for validation the office of the NFP validated the report using budget from some other budget line. We, therefore, request the UNCCD Secretariat to set aside budget for validation in future. The expenses needed for validation are not very large amount. We may need budget for photocopy and printer toners, photocopy papers, hall rent for half a day or a day, stationery to be given to validation workshop participants, flip charts, tea/coffee/mineral water/milk, etc at tea breaks, and lunch OR DSA based on UN rules and regulations as some participants come from far places whose input is very vital during validation. All

these expenses need to be covered by the Office of the NFP for Eritrea where currently it does not have budget to cover the above mentioned expenses.

2. As one can see from this report many integrated activities related to DLDD, biodiversity and climate smart agriculture have been undertaken in Eritrea. These activities are demand-driven and community-based with positive impact on the livelihoods of the rural communities; and in line with this the Government is raising the awareness of its people through different means as mentioned above on the causes and effects of DLDD, climate change and biodiversity loss and the need for synergy among the three Rio Conventions. These interventions are far reaching and are covering not less than 40% of the population.

3. As one can understand from this report the Government of the State of Eritrea has carried out many community-based and demand-driven activities related to DLDD, biodiversity and climate smart agriculture and to this end it has achieved many remarkable and commendable results that improved the livelihoods of its people especially the rural communities. It has shown progress towards achieving MDG no 7 sustainable natural resources management & the activities are in line with the UNCCD 10-Year Strategic objectives. Eritrea has shown an exhibition depicting the progress made towards achieving MDGs and UNCCD Strategies in the UNCCD funded exhibition made in Windhoek, the Republic of Namibia from 16-27 Sept 2013 it received commendable and encouraging comments and feedback from international observers. These achievements are also highlighted at the National Greening Day which takes place every 15 May in Asmara, Eritrea for the last nine years. We have reported this as one of the best practices in the Fourth Leg 2010-2011 UNCCD Best Practices Report.

4. The Government allocates adequate budget for the rehabilitation, conservation, development and sustainable management of its natural resources which is a sign of political will and dedication of the government and the Eritrean population. In addition to allocating adequate budget from the Government Treasury the farming communities contribute in kind which when calculated properly could be as high as and some times higher that the government contributions.

The budget allocated from the National Treasury of the Government and the contributions made from the communities is growing steadily annually. This is manifested by the growing number of interventions (projects/programmes) in activities related to DLDD, climate change and biodiversity including human and institutional capacity building endeavours. These interventions bring about many interrelated short-, medium-, and long-term impacts that lead to the improvement of the livelihoods of the rural communities.

5. A bulk of physical soil and water conservation structures coupled with tree planting are done through the participation of male and female farmers, students, army, police and other military personnel, etc. Most of these activities are not monetized properly hence it is very difficult to exactly quantify the amount spent on these activities.
