

The theme of desertification is consistently present in German secondary schools. There is also a wide range of information accessible in media.

However, a percentage in terms of informed population of Germany cannot be estimated. There is also a problem of double counting for the estimated no. of people reached by media. For example: It is possible that some people listen to more than one radio broadcast or watch another TV documentation on DLDD. These ones would be double counted and distort the actual number. Further arguments for leaving two fields blank are listed in the annex.
